

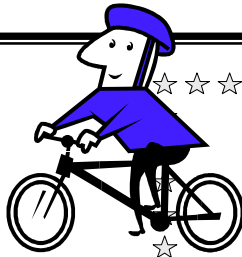
Year 5 Newsletter - January
